President's Message

Fifty years ago men, women, and children in Selma tried to walk across a bridge. They were met with dogs, guns, sticks and the brute rage of the state arrayed against them. Did they want to loot? Rob? Kill? No, they wanted to vote. This was apparently an act so shocking and terrifying to the power structure of the day that it was met with rage and violence rather than let the marchers pass.

Oh how times change, right? Now I wasn't there, so I was not a part of the culture and I didn't experience the debates that tore through the country back then. I only see the photos. Watch the movies. And as a result it is very, very difficult for me to understand how anyone could have thought the country would collapse due to black people voting.

Now we have a black man as president and so we have ostensibly progressed. Black people vote and hold office, so those days are behind us. So regrettable, but no longer an issue. Wrong. First of all the vote is under attack in ways more insidious than a stick or a bullet. Instead voter id laws, decrease in polling stations, the specter of voting fraud, and gerrymandering are all working far more effectively and

When you don't understand something look to see who benefits. Who benefits from blacks and poor whites and Hispanics not voting? The wealthy and entrenched. It's not that overt, ugly racism of the past because the threat to voting rights is applied equally across all races - denying access to those who might vote in opposition to the established power and wealth of our time.

As League member you know this. Voting rights is ongoing work to protect the rights of the many against the interests of the few. But the Selma of our times is not voting rights. It is gay marriage and access to health care. These are the current issues and ideological struggles that will make the children who will be born in five years look back and say "What on earth were you thinking?" as I do now when looking at the photos of a bridge in Alabama. "You let the poor die? You denied a social compact and legal rights to two people who want to love each other publicly?"

As League members, as educated citizens of our country with wealth and opportunity, we have an obligation to use our power and access to not to merely protect those who lack such gifts, but rather to share our power and opportunity with others. We ourselves must be a new-day bridge for those who lack the rights they clamor for – whether it is marriage, voting, or health care. We must make way for them through the thicket of legal attacks, power mongering, and fear and rage, and welcome them to the other side, our side.


Spring will bring more membership events and voter outreach. State League convention is in May in Cincinnati and Barbara and Oscar Hunsicker will be attending as our voting delegates.
