President's Message

Dear Members,

The march of the presidential nominees continues and on March 15 Ohio voters will cast their ballots for their favorite candidates for the final round of the general election. Ohio is one of eleven states to have a “winner take all” Primary, where the top Democratic and Republican candidates receive all their party’s delegate votes. The typical distribution is proportional to the percentage of votes each contender receives. By the time the March 15 votes are counted, voters will have a good, but not necessarily definite knowledge of which candidates will run in the General Election.

With all the attention on the Presidential Primary, it is understandable that voters may be less focused on other races that are also very important in shaping the makeup of our State and County government for the next several years. In Summit County, one U.S. Senate and four Congressional seats will be contested. In addition, the Chief Justice and two Justice Seats on the Ohio Supreme Court along with 9th district court of

**Are Drilling, Fracking and Compressor
Station Emissions Bad for Your
Health?**

In conjunction with the Sierra Club, we are excited to bring representatives who conducted an intensive study sponsored by the LWV of Pennsylvania Citizen Education Fund to the Akron Area for this program.

The presentation will include a brief overview of components of shale gas development (drilling, fracking, transmission etc.); an explanation of relevant research criteria; discussion of specific health impacts and current research; and what can be done to address health issues at a policy level. There will also be time set aside for questions.

Summary of the February 26 Lecture and Discussion on the Health of the Cuyahoga River

In partnership with the National Park Service, Conservancy for Cuyahoga Valley National Park, Cleveland Metroparks, Summit Metro Parks, Friends of the Crooked River, Cuyahoga River Restoration, and Ohio EPA, LWVAA co-sponsored a special evening event on Friday, February 26 with 146 attendees (including volunteers).

Thank you to Board Member Arrye Rosser, LWVAA Natural Resources Chair, for all of her hard work and for bringing this opportunity to LWVAA!



The keynote was delivered by Lyceum Distinguished Speaker Kyle Dreyfuss-Wells, Deputy Director of Watershed Programs, [Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District](#). She opened with a comprehensive overview of the issues surrounding Combined Sewer Overflow (CSO) which is found in 126 locations in NE Ohio. When the Sewer District was founded in 1972 there were nine billion gallons of untreated CSO emptied into the water, this has been reduced in half. She outlined three key issues that are impacting CSO:

1. Development
2. Lack of places for storm water to go
3. Erosion

There are two programs in place to address CSO, and time was spent covering both of them: [Project Clean Lake](#) and the [Regional Storm Water Management Program](#). The programs are being funded by fees collected based on the amount of impervious surfaces, which was put on hold during litigation, but will resume in the second half of 2016.

Individuals can [make a difference](#) on the impact of storm water (which impacts CSO), and also help by reducing the amount of impervious surfaces. This could

reduce the Sewer District fees which are based on the size of the impervious surfaces. Some examples include installing a cistern, adding a [rain garden](#), and many other options.

After the presentation, the audience split into several smaller groups to give input and learn from the sponsors. This was a great way to drive true dialogue and engagement, and included creative ideas to celebrate the 50th anniversary in 2019 of the Cuyahoga River catching fire.
