President's Message

Dear Members,

Each year on August 26, Women's Equality Day commemorates certification of the 19th Amendment which, in 1920, gave women the right to vote. Almost 100 years later, women vote at a higher rate than men (in 2012, about 10 million more women voted than men) but are still underrepresented in all levels of government. Now, in 2016, voters have their first opportunity to elect a woman President of the United States. History may be made almost a century after gaining the right to vote by having a woman occupy the highest position in government.

Every year since 1972, after Congresswoman Bella Abzug successfully gained passage of a resolution declaring August 26 Women's Equality Day, presidents have issued a proclamation recognizing the achievements and challenges that remain to have true gender equality. Following are excerpts from the first proclamation in 1973 by President Richard Nixon, and the most recent in 2015 by President Barack Obama.

"In recent years there have been great strides in extending the protection of the law to the rights of women, and in promoting equal opportunities for women . . . Although every woman may not desire a career outside the home, every woman should have the freedom to pursue whatever career she wishes. Although women today have a greater opportunity to do that, we still must do more to ensure every woman every opportunity to make the fullest contribution to our progress as a Nation." Richard M. Nixon, 1973

"Women's equality is a core civil and human rights principle in the United States and around the world. Across America, women are contributing to our economy and our Nation in innovative and exciting ways. From businesses to battlefields, women are vital to the prosperity and security of our country. As we celebrate the last 95 years of progress in advancing women's rights, let us rededicate ourselves to the idea that our Nation is not yet complete: there is still work to do to secure the blessings of our country for every American daughter." Barack Obama, 2015

The recurring theme noting the necessity to ensure that women have the same rights and opportunities as men in education, career, pay, representation in government and high levels of industry and commerce reminds us that although we have significant progress to celebrate, we still have a long way to go.

Tribute to Sally York, Joanne Shippy

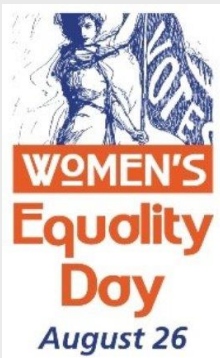

In Memoriam

In the 1980's and 90's Sally York and Joanne Shippy were major leaders in the actions and projects of LWVAA.

Sally was president from 1987 to 1989. She was a strong believer that meetings should never last longer than an hour or one hour fifteen minutes max. Her Board meetings achieved that goal, and all of the necessary business was accomplished. The fun, going out to eat, came later. She returned and worked as a co-president in 1997-1998 when the Board could only find "old" presidents to guide it. Sally was the League's secretary from 2005 to 2009. She also served as chairman of the Education Fund Board and was a member of that Board for many years.

Joanne was an avid advocate of voting, particularly in registering voters. She especially liked the slogan, "Voting is not a spectator sport!" She was



involved in expanding the distribution of the Voters Guide and publicizing our informative meetings before elections. Joanne was chairman of the League's Government committee for several years, was Vice President, Program, and then, Juvenile Justice chair. She, too, was a member of the Education Fund Board.

Physical problems curtailed their active participation, but neither stopped supporting the work of our League. The spirit and love of the League was evident whenever they were well enough to come to a meeting.

Both passed away this year, but the effects of their work on behalf of LWVAA will continue as a tribute to their dedication and leadership.

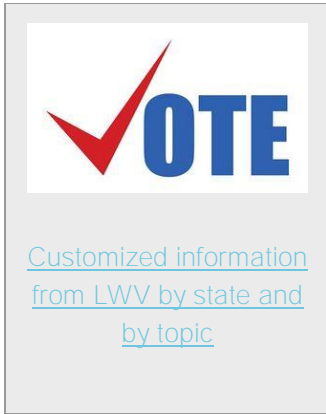
