Every 10 years the U.S. government is mandated to conduct a headcount of everyone - citizens and non-citizens - residing in the 50 states, Puerto Rico and the U.S. territorial islands. Headcount numbers are used to allocate federal dollars to state and local communities and are central to determining U.S. Congressional representation when districts are redrawn in 2021. But new methods including increased reliance on electronic participation and the current climate of mistrust in the government could impede participation.

They understood the motivations and manipulations of the men (mostly) and women who sought to preserve the old order and prevent women from gaining a voice in the legislative bodies that governed them.

Today we see an increasing infringement on women's health care rights and it would serve us well to understand why the effort to undermine the victories of the past has become such a defining issue for certain constituencies.

Forty-three candidates in contested Primary Election races in the cities of Akron and Green are being invited by the LWVAA to participate in the online [VOTE411.org](#) Voters Guide for the May 7 Primary Election.

They are being reminded that according to computer analytics over 10,000 Summit County residents used the [VOTE411.org](#) guide to help them make their voting decisions in 2018.

The candidates are provided links to their own personal site and instructed on how to post their photo and biographical data, and are also invited to answer several questions pertaining to their positions on local issues.

The information provided by the candidates will be published online at [VOTE411.org](#) after March 22.

In concert with our interest for supporting an informed electorate, we will be hosting a "Meet the Candidates Primary Election Forum" on Tuesday, April 16 at 6:30pm at the Akron-Summit County Public Library, 60 S. High St. The mayor and all city council seats will be up for election.

Attendees will have the chance to hear public statements from the candidates running for mayor, followed by audience Q&A in the first half of the program. The same format will be followed for the candidates running for city council at-large in the second half of the program.

LWVA to Set Local Positions, Priorities for 2019-2020

All members are invited to attend our LWVA Positions and Priorities Meeting on March 7. We will hold our regular Board Meeting at Westminster Presbyterian Church, 1250 W.

Exchange St., from 6-7pm and then at 7:15pm, welcome all members to share their input for the Board's decision-making as we update our local positions and priorities for the next year.

Please review the current local positions located in your Member Handbook received earlier this year in advance of the meeting.

I shared the following ideas with the Board as possible ways in which we may work on effecting a change this year in alignment with our mission:

- Promote Election Day as a paid holiday. Sandusky recently swapped its Columbus Day holiday for Election Day as a paid holiday for its city employees. The city hopes to encourage private companies to follow suit as they emphasize the importance of voting. Cincinnati is considering a similar measure and we could promote the same to our city council.
- Work on expanding the jury pool to include individuals with driver's licenses. This will provide more representative juries and negate the argument we often hear: "I'm not registering to vote because I don't want to be called for jury duty"


